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The theory incorporates several constructs from personality psychology, vocational behavior, and social psychology, including self-perception theory and social stereotyping. Applications of Holland's theory of vocational choice involve assessing individuals in terms of two or three prominent personality types and then matching the respective types with the environmental aspects of potential careers.

Super's Developmental Self-Concept Theory Vocational development is the process of developing and implementing a self-concept. As the self-concept becomes more realistic and stable, so does vocational choice and behavior. People choose occupations that permit them to express their self-concepts.

HOLLAND'S OCCUPATIONAL PERSONALITY TYPES

The Holland Codes or the Holland Occupational Themes (RIASEC) refers to a theory of careers and vocational choice (based upon personality types) that was initially developed by American psychologist John L. Holland.

Making Vocational Choices: A Theory of Vocational ...

The 1959 article in particular ("A Theory of Vocational Choice," published in the Journal of Counseling Psychology) is considered the first major introduction of Holland's "theory of vocational personalities and work environments." Holland originally labeled his six types as "motoric, intellectual,esthetic, supportive, persuasive, and conforming."

Vocational Personalities and Work Environments Theory Also known as Vocational Choice Theory. John L. Holland (1966, 1997) theorized that matching people to their jobs was key, yet he emphasized the importance of the individuals' personality (i.e., interests) in their career choices.
