Building Positive Teacher-Student Relationships with PBIS ...

A 2016 report from the University of Cambridge found that students who had a positive relationship with their teacher displayed 18% more 'prosocial' behaviour towards their peers, and up to 10% even two years later. They also manifested up to 38% less aggressive behaviour (and 9% up to four years later).
