The standard of care in suicide risk assessment requires that clinicians conduct thorough suicide risk assessments when patients screen positive for suicide risk and then make reasonable formulations of risk. 1 One barrier to ensuring that staff are consistently screening and assessing risk is mistaken beliefs about suicide and its causes.
