Upon completion, the Twin Towers were briefly the tallest buildings in the world, and at the time of the terrorist attacks they were still in the top five. One World Trade Center (WTC 1) the "North Tower" was, at 1,368 feet (417 m), six feet taller than Two World Trade Center (WTC 2) the "South Tower", which stood 1,362 ft (415 m) tall.

The towers were designed as framed tube structures, which provided tenants with open floor plans, uninterrupted by columns or walls. This was accomplished using numerous closely spaced perimeter columns to provide much of the strength to the structure, along with gravity load shared with the core columns.

It was completed in 1972, stood at a height of 417 metres (1,368 ft), and was the tallest building in the world until 1973, when surpassed by the Sears Tower in Chicago. It was distinguishable from its twin, the original Two World Trade Center, also known as the South Tower, by the 110.3-metre (362 ft) telecommunications antenna on its roof.

The facades of the twin towers were constructed of aluminum and steel lattice, built of a lightweight tube construction with 244 closely spaced columns on the outer walls and no interior columns in office spaces. An 80-centimeter tall web joist connected the core to the perimeter on each floor.
